

Protecting the Vulnerable in the Time of COVID-19



Throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Catholic Charities Southwestern Ohio and Su Casa Hispanic Center have continued to serve local families and change local lives. For the first three months of the pandemic, we provided \$289,034 in adaptive works of mercy to help families meet emergency needs, remain safe and cope under stressful conditions.

COVID-19 Response: April – June 2020



Food for All Pantries transitioned to drive-thrus

- 116,164 meals to 4,020 families (duplicated), including USDA Farms to Families partnership



Su Casa Hispanic Center and Refugee Resettlement Services

- 65 vulnerable families assisted with \$30,961 in rent and utilities
- 427 care packages of personal protective equipment; emergency food and supplies, like diapers, and COVID-19 safety awareness



Multilingual Mental Health and Early Childhood Mental Health

- 905 counseling sessions, including telehealth
- Over half of sessions offered free of charge due to increased needs
- 203 early childhood consultations to staff and families in pandemic child care centers



AccuracyNow Language Services

- 2,202 hours of interpretation services
- Interpreters serve on the frontlines with healthcare workers and COVID-19 positive patients



Additional services ...

- 72 people assisted with unemployment benefits and 39 job placements
- 223 hours of caregiver support, held outdoors, by phone and video conferencing
- 648 hours of check-ins with senior neighbors
- 98 weekly, remote education sessions
- 107 immigration legal services, including asylum seekers
